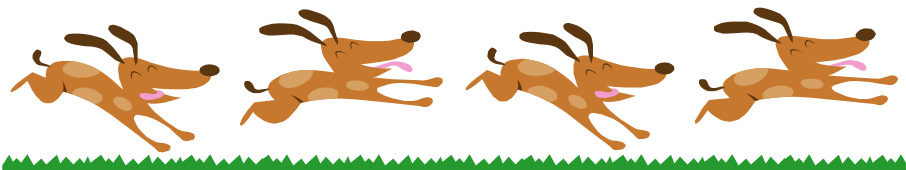

What to bring:

- Your dog (must bring proof of current vaccinations) * puppies must be at least 4 months of age
- 6 ft. leash (must)
- Pinch collar or choke chain (must)
- Crate for your dog (must)



- Bowl/dog food
- Bottled water, drinks, snacks
- Whistle/lanyard/duck call
- Sturdy shoes (no sandals or flip flops for dog training)
- Casual clothes - suitable for dog training
- Linens (twin sheets) pillow, blanket or sleeping bag
- Towels, wash cloths, shower shoes
- Personal hygiene items (soap, shampoo, etc.)
- Swim suit, beach towel, old tennis shoes for the lake



Do Not Bring:

Camp participants should not bring the items listed below due to safety hazards and very full dorms. We also want to insure that the potential for loss is reduced. Please leave the following items at home:

- Valuables such as expensive jewelry
- Ipods, MP3 Players, etc..
- Roller blades, skateboards, roller skates, scooters
- Small video games
- Excessive amounts of money
- Excessive amounts of food, ice

*Cell phones may be brought - however - they may not be brought to training sessions and will only be allowed in the event of an emergency or after all activities are over in the evenings.
